Next Generation Statement

On February 24, 2024, someone posted on the HT-FT Network Facebook group that they were looking for a Chessie with exceptional lines to add to their family. The following exchange of comments occurred:

Devon Kipp Levy:

Looks [sic] up Next generation gundogs in MN

Post Author:

Devon Kipp Levy aren't thoes [sic] that people the [sic] caused the big issue with chessiebook and stole a bunch of information?

Devon Kipp Levy:

... a friend of theirs [sic] screenshot pedigrees off of chessie book when she was wrongfully locked out of the site. I don't understand why wanting to study pedigrees to help breed good dogs and better the breed is such a bad thing. Next generation has time and time again produced beautiful animals that can work and unfortunately when you are at the top jealousy and agendas against them have taken place.

I think the whole thing with that chessie book ordeal was a bunch of adults acting like they were back in high school.

A public database should never be ran [sic] by such a biased person. Pedigrees should always be public knowledge.

Post Author:

Devon Kipp Levy im [sic] just stating what I've read and heard is all

Adam Levy:

I'm sorry people have to be subjected to that. It's bad for the breed. I'm happy to answer any questions.

The breed club has a wonderful database inclusive to all breeders.

Frank Pittelli:

... you can read what actually happened in the following detailed report that has not been refuted by anyone. You can decide for yourself who is telling the truth about what transpired. https://chessiebook.org/public/2024-11-05%20Incident%20Report.pdf

For the record, as fully documented in the "2024-11-05 Incident Report", Drew Terranova, a Next Generation employee, downloaded 5,000+ complete profiles from ChessieBook over a 10 day period, using both her personal devices and a Next Generation computer while working for Next Generation. Her husband, Greg Terranova, and her employers, Adam Levy and Devon Kipp Levy, all knew that she was improperly accessing ChessieBook, but Drew's actions did not stop until the entire system was shutdown on November 5, 2024. Adam Levy subsequently lied in public and private about his own improper use of ChessieBook, as proven by his wife, Devon Kipp Levy, in a written statement to the contrary.

None of the people involved in the incident have admitted or apoligized for their actions. Rather, they continue to spin a story, as demonstrated above, that attempts to make them innocent victims of circumstances.
